### **RFP GUIDELINES**

Thank you for taking the time to submit a Project Proposal to the California Deer Association.

Please read and follow these important guidelines carefully while you prepare your proposal.

1. **CDA does not pay or intend to pay Salaries, Administrative Costs, nor Maintenance on previously funded/completed projects.** This applies to all agencies, both State and Federal.

2. **Submissions must be made in electronic format.** In the past, we have had to spend many hours scanning paper submissions in order to get them into a format that our printer can use. Please fill out the **Project Narrative** in MS Word and submit in either Word or PDF. Submit all maps and photos in PDF format as attachments.

3. Please use the PDF titled "**2020 Request for Proposal**" available on our website to submit your project proposal. Please complete the "**Project Narrative**" portion of the application using MS Word (or equivalent) and attach any additional information (i.e. maps, brief photos) as PDF's. We would like to keep the RFP brief, but include as much detail as necessary to adequately describe the proposal, particularly if it involves a research component.

*\* Note: Agencies may use the electronic signature block on the PDF.*

4. If you are submitting a research proposal, please include a complete, detailed study proposal that has been approved by your agency. We will not consider a proposal that has not been adequately reviewed and approved by the submitting agency.

6. **Proposals must be submitted by Friday, 01 May 2020.**

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### Appendix B

#### RANKING CRITERIA

##### 1. Habitat Project Criteria

- Will the project produce recognizable results with a high probability of success
- Does the Project address the limiting factors for the herd(s)
- Are there cost share dollars available from other sources (In-kind; currently funded; applied for)
- Will the project have high visibility and provide recognition for CDA
- Will the project benefit a herd that provides public access and hunting
- Is the project mentioned, either specifically or generally, in the appropriate deer herd management plan

##### 2. Land Acquisition and Conservation Easements

- Subject Property contingent to Public Land or used by deer herds migrating to public domain
- Acreage affected and deer population estimates
- Encroachment threat
- Long term plan for management and costs of up-keep

##### 3. Research Projects

- Does the project have reasonable potential to provide information that will affect land use or management programs
- Does the information gathered have statewide implications
- Are there cost share dollars available from other sources (In-kind; currently funded; applied for)
- Is there a high probability of success
- Does the project address the limiting factors for the herd(s)
- Does the project have general appeal/application with a high visibility and provide recognition for CDA
- As a result, will there be a follow up project to implement "on the ground" work to address the results of the research project

##### 4. Equipment Requests

- Does the purchase and use of this equipment significantly increase research or habitat potential in a given area
- Does this equipment have statewide use
- Are there cost share dollars available from other sources (currently funded; applied for; in-kind)
- What is the expected useful life of the equipment
- Does the use of this equipment address the limiting factors for the herd(s)

##### 5. Public Education/Outreach

- Does the project have general appeal/application
- Are there cost share dollars available from other sources (currently funded; in-kind; applied for)
- Will the project have high visibility and provide recognition for the CDA
- Will the project/information encourage and promote public awareness of California Deer issues

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
